This is our third year to sell fruit plants. We will carry some accessories such as irrigation supplies, ground sulfur, horticultural oil, grow tubes for grapes, and some tools.

Inventories are being increased annually as demand warrants. Stock is limited in many varieties as we build customer demand for these items. Extra plants are potted up at the end of the bare root planting season, and are available during the summer and in the fall. Plants are sold in dormant condition, in most cases bare-root, and ready to plant. Please ask for instructions for how to plant a potted plant. Attend one of our instructional seminars to learn about fruit culture and ask questions. Ask for the schedule of seminars.

## 1. BERRIES

**Blueberries (*Vaccinium corymbosum*-highbush and *V. corymbosum* X *V. angustifolium*- halfhigh [HH])~ selected for cold-hardiness, decorative value in landscape, and flavor/quality of berries. Varieties are listed in order of bearing, early to late. Potted plants \$18-20, bare root plants \$12-16.**

Duke- medium-sized fruit of excellent quality, yield 10-15 #/plant 4-6' high.

Spartan- large, firm fruit, good ornamental, yield 8-12 #/plant 5-7' high

Blue Jay-medium-large-sized fruit, mild-flavored, yield 10-20 #/plant 5-7' high

Earliblue-medium-large-sized fruit, nice ornamental, yield 5-10 #/plant 4-6' high

**Ribes (*Ribes spp*)~ This group includes gooseberries and all currants. Selections for varieties have improved greatly over the years. Gooseberry selections are sweeter and larger than in the past. Prices range from \$12 to \$16 depending on source and patents.**

**Gooseberries \$14, (\$16 Tixia)**

Invicta- early, large green to white fruit, plant mildew immune  
Tixia- bright red, large good flavored fruit, disease resistant plant  
Poorman- red, medium-sized fruit, east coast standard variety  
Friend- tasty, reddish-pink berries, few thorns  
Jahn's Prarie- large, red-pink berries, very disease resistant  
Jewel- Heavy crops of sweet, peach-colored berries  
Captivator- antique red, tear drop shaped fruit, few thorns

**Strawberries (*Fragaria spp*)- Summer varieties were selected for size, flavor, and to have a long season. Alpine strawberries are small, but included for culinary use and high flavor. Day-neutral plants bear the year they are planted, and all season long. Summer plants are listed in order of bearing. Recommend plant 10-25 of each variety. Prices are \$0.50 /plant; for 100+, \$0.40 /plant; and alpine, \$6 /plant.**

**Only potted alpine and Seascape plants available after June 15. Bare root season is April 15-June 15.**

**Day Neutral- berries all summer, grower-friendly**

Albion- a large uniform fruit and presents a distinguishable robust flavor and a rich red color. Plants of Albion have excellent [disease](#) resistance to several major soil-borne pathogens. In general, Albion is resistant to most [disease](#) and mites that plague plants of similar class and species.

Aromas- Produces large fruit on an erect, vigorous plant. Resistant to powdery mildew and spider mites.

Fern- Older variety, dependable.

Seascape- best day-neutral for NE, medium- large sweet fruit, first fruit, first month and fruit through October with protection

**Summer Bearing- must grow for one season, and will bear the following summer. Fruits are usually larger-sized than the day-neutrals. Varieties chosen for size, flavor, winter hardiness, and an extended harvest season**

Annapolis- early, good flavor

Wendy- wedge-shaped to conic, excellent flavor, bright red

Honeoye- early-mid, excellent flavor, large, good for the freezer

L'Amour-large berries with good flavor and freezing quality

Darselect- early-mid, very good flavor, very productive

Mesabi- mid, excellent flavor, low spray needs

Jewel- late-mid, a favorite for superb fruit quality and size

Sparkle- small to medium berries, excellent flavor and freezing

Cabot- late-mid, very large, best tasting berry

Eros- large, good for freezing and fresh

Ovation- large berries with good flavor and freezing qualities

Idea- late, sweet, mild flavor, light red color when ripe

**Alpine (*Fragaria vesca*)**

Alexandria small, sweet, fragrant, fruit all summer

**Other Berries**

**Autumn Olive (*Elaeagnus umbellata*) \$15**

Ruby- heavy crops of red berries in September, disease and pest free

**Aronia** (chokeberry *Aronia melanocarpa*)- the highest antioxidant berry. Fruit should be processed to be palatable. Heavy yielding, decorative landscape plants.

All varieties are about the same. **\$16**

Viking- vigorous, 6' high, productive

**Chinese Haw (*Crataegus pinnatifida*) \$20**

Red Sun- one inch red sweet fruit, Showy foliage

**Cranberry (*Vaccinium macrocarpon*)-** sold in 4" and gallon pots, should buy at least 5 plants. They can be grown without a bog. Spreading to form good ground cover. **\$5 and \$8**

Ben Lear- early ripening, large, good production

Pilgrim- Self-fertile and hardy to -30 degrees F. Plants begin bearing 1 to 2 years after planting. Large, tasty red berries that ripen in fall.

Stevens- popular commercial variety

**Cranberry, Highbush (*Viburnum opulus*)**

Ukraine- Ukraine, this superior variety produces abundant crops of large, high quality fruit, accented by colorful fall foliage.

**Elderberry (*Sambucus nigra* and *S. canadensis*) \$12**

York- pollinates Nova, high yield

Nova- pollinates York, high yield

Goldbeere- upright growing shrub, large clusters of golden berries

Haschberg- large juicy, flavorful, bluish-black berries

Korsor- good fruiting characteristics, flavorful and good color

Samdal- compact bush, abundant canes, 5-6" clusters

Samyl- similar to Samdal, less dense, but productive

**Goumi (*Eleagnus multiflora*) \$16**

Sweet Scarlet- shrub 6' high, white flowers, red, tasty fruits, early

**Honeyberry (*Lonicera caerulea*) \$18** Hardy and later blooming (two new varieties to be added and available in mid-May)

Berry Blue- Vigorous, upright, with large, sweet, tasty berries, 8' high

Blue Bird- upright, medium vigor, large, long tasty berries, 5-6' tall

Blue Moon- large, light-blue elongated fruits

Blue Velvet- spreading bush, large tasty fruits

**Lingonberry (*Vaccinium vitis-idaea*) \$5 small, Need acid soil.**

Erntestegen- vigorous, large fruit, deep red

Red Pearl- very vigorous, yield 1-1.5#/plant

Regal- vigorous plant, medium to large berries.

Susi- slow-growing, but productive, good flavor

Variety Unnamed- one of our supplier sent unnamed varieties

**Rose Hips (*Rosa rugosa*), \$18**

Jubilee- Jubilee produces an abundance of meaty rose hips and loads of beautiful reddish purple single flowers.

**Sea Buckthorn (*Hippophae rhamnoides*)** Decorative shrub with healthy orange berries. **\$18 and \$25**

Male (Indiana Berry)- for pollination one per eight plants

Amber Dawn- fruit is sweet enough to eat fresh, 4-6' high

Botanica- superior variety, large, flavorful fruit.

Golden Sweet- fruit is sweet and abundant, edible fresh, 8-12' high

Radiant- large fruits high in vitamins ACE

Siberian Splendor-small shrub, sweet fruit, productive

Star of Altai- fruit for fresh eating and juice, 6-8' high

Sunny- new, recommended variety, 5-8' high  
Titan- large flavorful, aromatic berries, shrub 10' high

## 2. TREE FRUIT

### Pome Fruit

**Apples- (*Malus communis*) I have selected the following varieties for desirable fruit quality and disease resistance. They are mostly on M7 rootstock which gives a medium-sized tree growing to about 15 feet, and not needing staking.  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch caliper trees: \$20, \$23 potted.**

CandyCrisp- yellow, taste is similar to a pear, very sweet and juicy, disease resistant.

CrimsonCrisp- disease resistant, medium- sized, grower friendly, crisp, tart, red, stores well for 6 months in refrigerator.

Earlichief- early red delicious

Enterprise- spicy, aromatic, good storage capability.

Freedom- disease resistant, multipurpose fruit, red over yellow background color.

GoldRush- resists scab, fire blight, and mildew. Golden, sweet, crisp long keeping fruit. Pollinate with Jonafree, Enterprise or Red Fuji.

GrandGala- sweet, tart taste and firm, fine flesh in a very large, bright-red apple, resists cedar apple rust. Pollinate with Red Fuji, or others on our list.

Honeycrisp- orange-red, juicy, sweet, crisp fruit, moderate resistance to scab and fire blight. Pollinate with Redfree or Liberty.

Jonafree- Jonathan-like fruit with a bit less acid. Bred to fight fungus and insects so you spend less time maintaining it and use fewer chemicals to do so. Pollinate with GoldRush or Enterprise.

Liberty- red, yellow-fleshed apple resistant to scab, cedar apple rust, fire blight, mildew. Pollinate with Honeycrisp or Pristine.

Macoun- popular in NE, needs aggressive pruning, fruit high quality. Pollinate with most any other apple we offer.

Myra Fuji- a Stark Fuji selection similar to Red Fuji

Pristine- golden, early, sweet apple, good keeper, disease resistant except fire blight. Pollinate with most any other apple we offer.

Red Fuji- red, aromatic, sweet, cream-colored flesh that's crisp and juicy. Pollinate with another apple from our list.

Redfree- red dessert apple, resistant to scab, cedar apple rust, fire blight, mildew. Pollinate with any other apple on our list.

Scarlet Surprise- Beautiful bright red flesh! Spectacular deep pink blossoms in spring followed by reddish foliage. Medium-sized, red-skinned fruit is sweet and flavorful.

SnowSweet- late season, good sugar acid balance, slow to brown

Smoothee- golden delicious, russet resistant

Zestar- early red with excellent flavor, keeps 6-8 weeks

**Pears- I have chosen the most popular European (OHxF97 rootstock) *Pyrus communis* and Asian pears (Betufovia rootstock) *Pyrus pyrifolia*. The Asian pears do very well in our area, and have crispy, juicy texture. Plant two varieties of Asian, or two varieties of European pears for pollination. \$22 bare root, \$26 potted.**

### **European Pears**

Bartlett- standard eating pear, green to yellow skin, white flesh, sweet  
Buerre Bosc- russeted pear, sweet white flesh, slow growing, productive  
Harrow Delight- fire blight resistant, green skin, white juicy flesh, early  
Magness- Flesh is soft, juicy and almost free of grit cells. Flavor is sweet and of excellent quality. Tree is vigorous, spreading and very resistant to fire blight. Magness does not produce good pollen. Medium sized fruit. (Sold Out)  
Seckel- small, one of sweetest, aromatic pears, vigorous, hardy tree (Sold Out)

### **Asian Pears**

20<sup>th</sup> Century- yellow skin, white flesh, great flavor (sold out)  
Chojuro- dark golden fruit with rum-like flavor, large fruit.  
Hosui- mild flavor, juicy and sweet, thin to attain size  
Nijiseiki- greenish-yellow fruit, large, flavorful, crisp.  
Large Korean- (Olympic) size of grapefruit, sweet, crisp, light brown, October  
Shinko- butterscotch pear, dark golden skin  
Shinseiki/OHx F513 rootstock- early, yellow, little russet, medium-sized, crisp, juicy fruit, August  
Yoinashi- Fruit is large, orange-brown, with a russeted finish. Yoinashi™ produces crisp, richly aromatic firm-fleshed fruit. Tree is upright and medium in vigor.

**Quince- chosen for size and fragrant flavor. Self-fertile. *Cydonia oblonga*. \$20**

Aromatnaya- Russian quince, lemony, sweet, yellow skin, edible fresh  
Crimea- Russian Quince, pineapple & citrus-like flavor  
Smyrna- very large fruit, lemon-yellow skin  
Van Deman- large, waxy, oblong, spicy flavor  
Victory- scarlet red flowering and large attractive yellow fruits

**Medlar- Self-fertile. (*Mespilus germanica*) \$20**

Breda Giant- large, sweet, flavorful fruit which ripens on tree, 8-10' high  
Marron- large, sweet chestnut colored fruit

### **Stone Fruit**

**Apricot- Plant any two varieties for pollination. (*Prunus armeniaca*) on Manchurian rootstock \$20 (\$28 aprium)**

Harcot- deep golden, firm flesh. Can overset, good to thin

Harglow- medium size, bright orange apricot produces firm, freestone fruit with good texture and flavor. Tree is compact, late blooming, productive, disease resistant and cold-hardy.

Hargrande- cold hardy, largest size

Harogem- medium-sized, orange, firm, freestone, good flavor

SweetHeart- flesh is juicy and firm with a sprightly flavor. Kernels are edible.

Aprium (apricot/plum cross), Honeyrich- red- orange

Tasty Rich- yellow- orange

**Cherry, Sweet- (*Prunus avium*) Plant two for pollination. \$20**

Kristin/Colt-semi-dwarf, very hardy, large, dark, firm, sweet fruit

Lapins/Colt- semi-dwarf, self-fertile, large, sweet cherries, one of the best

Blackgold/MM14- late blooming to avoid late frosts, frost tolerance, self-pollination, heavy crops of cherries, disease resistance, mid-season maturity and heart-shape fruit with excellent flavor that's resistant to cracking.

Rainier/Mazzard- large golden-yellow fruit (Sold Out)

Regina/Mahaleb- fruit is large and it is a new commercial variety. Late blooming and late ripening.

Sam/Mahaleb- disease resistant, fruit is large, black, delicious and shows good resistance to cracking.

Summit/Mazzard- fruit is large, heart-shaped, and cherry red, with good flavor. It is somewhat resistant to cracking.

UlsterMahaleb- large, dark red, resists cracking

**Cherry, Sour- (*Prunus cerasus*) \$20**

Balaton- sweet sour cherry ripening after Danube, good for processing/fresh

Danube- sweet sour cherry, medium to large, high anti-oxidant cherry, self fertile

Surefire- later ripening, resists spring frosts, bright red, medium- sized

**Nectarine- Self-fertile. (*Prunus persica*) \$20**

Emeraude- white flesh, low acid variety with good flavor and a very clean finish

Fantasia/Lovell- excellent, yellow-fleshed freestone. Trees vigorous and hardy.

Flavortop/Red Leaf- Large size, high quality yellow-fleshed.

RedGold/Lovell- very high quality late nectarine, yellow free stoned, late.

SunGlo/Lovell- yellow-fleshed, high quality mid-season

Zephyr- A white fleshed freestone nectarine ripening with Fantasia. The fruit is large and freestone with excellent flavor. The tree is vigorous, productive and moderately resistant to bacterial leaf spot.

**Peach- Self-fertile. (*Prunus persica*) \$20**

Blushingstar/Red Leaf root - late-season white peach. Expect bountiful harvests of beautiful, freestone peaches from this hardy tree. They have firm, white flesh with a unique, sweet flavor.

Coralstar- large fruit, hardy tree, orange- red stripes over yellow.

Easternglo- yellow freestone

Flamin Fury PF5D- large early variety, firm, few split pits, 90% red

Flamin Fury 15A- large yellow, heavy cropping.  
Flamin Fury 23- medium-large, yellow fruit. Trees winter-hardy.  
Flamin Fury 24-007- the World's Largest Peach. Large crops of juicy, sweet, gigantic peaches.  
Flamin Fury 27A- large, very firm yellow  
Galaxy- large, white-fleshed freestone  
Harrow Diamond/Lovell- hardy, early, excellent quality  
NJF-16 Peento- golden flat shaped peach, firm flesh.  
Redhaven/Lovell- the standard peach for the NE. Productive, bud-hardy.  
Saturn/Lovell- donut-shaped, flat fruit, delicious flavor  
Starfire- medium-sized, freestone, red over yellow, hang well on tree.  
White Lady- aromatic, excellent flavor, firm, white flesh

**Plum- (*Prunus spp*) \$24 (\$28 pluots)**

**Japanese Myro seedling rootstock (plant these two for pollination)**

Pluot (plum/apricot cross) Flavor Grenade- light red- yellow

Dapple Dandy- purple over green

Duarte- Duarte plum is a large, heart-shaped, deep red fruit with a sweet blood-red flesh that is excellent for fresh eating or canning. A vigorous and hardy tree.

Early Golden- Earliest Japanese plum in production in New York. Yellow; good quality; round fruit. Ripens in mid-July. Pollenizer required.

Red Heart- Redheart is a magnificent Japanese plum with deep-red skin you open to a fine-grain, bright-red flesh. (sold out)

Shiro- yellow, sweet, juicy cling fruit.

Simka- This dark purple red plum is large and uniform. The yellow-white flesh is sweet with a firm texture.

**European (plant two for pollination)**

Bluebyrd- sweeter blue plums, heavy bearer, pollinate w/ Stanley, large fruit

Castleton-(sold out)

Damson- ripe in early September, tart, juicy, yellow-greenflesh

Earliblue- easiest plum tree to grow. Super hardy and those unpredictable spring frosts won't hurt it. Fruit has inviting purple-blue skin and a sweet, tempting taste.

Empress- larger, sweet, firm, European plum with beautiful color, inside and out.

Tree is very strong, vigorous and productive. (Sold Out 2008)

Fortune- fruit is very large with a bright red skin on yellow background, firm-fleshed -- perhaps the very best eating of the Japanese plums. Clingstone. Does best on heavier soils. Among the most consistent croppers at Geneva.

Long John- large, long, teardrop-shaped, attractive blue plum with fruits that are freestone and very high quality. The tree is upright, spreading and somewhat willowy in growth. In taste tests this has been my favorite. Partially self-fruitful.

NY9- tree is upright and spreading; good vigor. Fruit is medium-large, freestone.

Stanley- medium-sized fruit, freestone, vigorous tree, self- fruitful.

Valor- Dark purple skin, greenish-yellow flesh. Freestone when ripe; late midseason. Very sweet. Self-fertile; very productive.

Vision- September ripening, large, sweet, excellent fresh fruit quality.

### **Japanese/European Hybrid**

Waneta Plum- ripe early, in August or Sept. red skin, yellow flesh

### **Other**

#### **Cornelian Cherry- Plant these two for cross-pollination. (*Cornus mas*) \$20**

B-2-34- new selection for our area, good for trial

Elegant- long, tasty, pear-shaped fruit, tree 12-15' high

Pioneer- large, pear-shaped fruits, early ripening, 1 ½" long

Red Dawn- red, cylindrical fruit.

Red Star- exceptionally large, glossy-red tasty fruit

Yellow- oval, yellow fruit

#### **Mountain Ash (*Sorbus aucuparia*) \$20**

Ivan's Belle- mountain ash crossed with hawthorne, wine-red, sweet-tart for wine and preserves or eaten fresh

Rabina- large, bright orange fruit that can be eaten fresh, tree 12-15' high

**Mulberry (*Morus spp*) \$16-** Illinois Everbearing- 1 ½ inch long sweet, juicy fruit ripen June to August. Self-fertile, hardy to -25F

#### **Paw Paw- Plant two varieties for pollination. (*Asimina triloba*) \$20**

Mango- most vigorous but small tree, large, flavorful, yellow-orange-fleshed fruit

Mitchell- golden flesh, yellowish skin, medium size, excellent flavor

NC-1- new early-ripening. Large, flavorful fruit

Pennsylvania Golden- sweet, flavorful, early ripening.

Prolific- bears early (sometimes 2 years after planting), medium to large fruit

Sunflower- very large, sweet, creamy yellow flesh

Sweet Alice- slow-growing, but large very sweet, orange-yellow fruit

Taylor- fruit clusters with up to seven fruits, sweet, light-yellow flesh

Taytwo hardy selection bears large, flavorful, light yellow flesh

Wells- large, flavorful, orange flesh and green skin

Wilson- early ripening, delicious large greenish-yellow fruit

#### **Persimmon, American- Somewhat self-fertile (*Diosporos virginiana*) \$26**

Early Golden- very reliable, sweet deep orange fruit, mostly self-fertile

**Akeiba- Needs cross pollination from two varieties to produce sausage or starfish-like fruit with bland flavor, but curiosity item. (Akebia spp) \$12 bare root, \$16 potted**

Purple Rose- reddish, purple, fragrant flowers.

Purple Incense- fragrant flowers and large fruit.

Silver Bells- pink and reddish flowers.

**Grapes, Table \$8 bare root \$12 potted Mostly seedless selections are offered including varieties that were developed in the Northeast.**

Canadice- a favorite red seedless grape selection, sweet and great flavor. Hardy like Concord.

Concord Seedless- similar in flavor and texture to Concord, but unrelated.

Einset- hardy, red, mild labrusca/strawberry flavor.

Glenora- blue, seedless, vigorous. Flavor is very mild and pleasant.

Himrod- green, seedless, and good for making raisins. Vine yields 10-15 lbs. of fruit.

Jupiter- reddish-blue to blue seedless muscat variety with oval berries having firm flesh and resistance to cracking. While not as intense in flavor as New York Muscat, Jupiter is the best seedless American hybrid muscat yet. Productivity is quite good.

Lakemont- easy to grow, disease resistant, vigorous, sweet, golden-green fruit.

Marquis- large, white, seedless, midseason, let fully ripen on vine.

Mars- blue, seedless grape, good hardiness and disease resistance.

Neptune\_ black seedless grape

Reliance- pink, seedless, hardy, disease-resistant.

Remaily- white table grape

Romulus- white table grape(sold out)

Saturn- red table grape(sold out)

Suffolk Red- red table grape

Vanessa- translucent red, sweet, tangy grapes, disease resistant.

Venus- black seedless table grape

Stueben- seeds, but excellent flavor, hardy, disease resistant.
